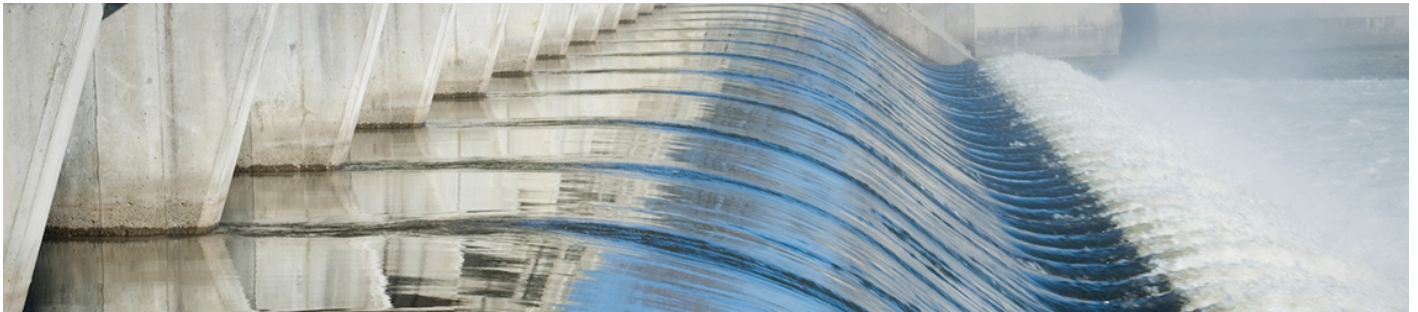


Hydropower and Water
